Getting to the Lockyer Valley

Driving from Brisbane	Follow the M2 Ipswich Motorway and take the Toowoomba exit onto the Warrego Highway, A2 at Dinmore. The Warrego Highway runs directly through the Lockyer Valley.	
From the Brisbane Airport	Airport Flyer – mini-coach commuter service between Toowoomba and Brisbane Airport, stopping at both terminals. Bus – Apart from Translink bus route 539, Greyhound Australia and Murray’s Coaches provide daily coach services between Brisbane and Toowoomba, stopping at Plainland, UQ Gatton Campus, Gatton and Withcott. The service will also stop at Grantham, Helidon and Helidon Spa on request. Visitors disembarking at the airport can also travel by Airtrain to Central Station in the city and then take connecting rail and bus services to the Lockyer Valley. Airtrain tickets can be purchased at both the Domestic and International Terminal Stations from the platform ticket offices. Ticket purchases can also be made online.
